#### **RESOLUTION FL-AL 08-21**

A RESOLUTION OF THE FLORIDA-ALABAMA TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION ENDORSING THE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEAR 2009 THROUGH FISCAL YEAR 2013.

WHEREAS, the Florida-Alabama Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the organization designated by the Governors of Florida and Alabama as being responsible, together with the States of Florida and Alabama, for carrying out provisions of 23 U.S.C. 134(h) and (i) (2), (3), and (4); 23 CFR 450.324, 326, 328, 330, and 332; and Section 339.175(5) and (7), Florida Statutes; and"

WHEREAS, the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) shall be endorsed annually upon a roll call vote by the TPO and submitted to the Governor of the State of Florida and the State of Alabama, to the Federal Transit Administration, and through the States of Florida and Alabama to the Federal Highway Administration;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE FLORIDA – ALABAMA TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION THAT:

- 1. The Fiscal Year 2009 through 2013 Transportation Improvement Program is hereby endorsed as an accurate representation of the area's transportation priorities, as developed through a continuing and comprehensive planning process carried out cooperatively by the State of Florida and local communities in accordance with the metropolitan planning provisions of U.S.C. 134;
- 2. Management and amendment of the TIP shall be completed according to Resolution FL-AL 07-31.

#### METROPOLITAN PLANNING **ORGANIZATION**

(Extract from Chapter 339.175, FS, 2003)

It is the intent of the Legislature to encourage and promote the safe and efficient management, operation, and development of surface transportation systems that will serve the mobility needs of people and freight within and through the urbanized areas of this state, while minimizing transportation-related fuel consumption and air pollution.

To accomplish these objectives, metropolitan planning organizations, referred to in this section as MPO, shall develop, in cooperation with the state and public transit operators, transit plans and programs for metropolitan areas. The plans and programs for each metropolitan area must provide for the development and integrated management and operation of transportation systems and facilities, including pedestrian walkways and bicycle transportation the President on August 10, 2005. All transporfacilities that will function as an intermodal transportation system for the metropolitan area, based upon the prevailing principles provided in 334.046(1).

The process for developing such plans and programs shall provide for consideration of all modes of transportation and shall be continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive, to the ment ordinances and guidelines. The following degree appropriate, based on the complexity of lists important highlights of SAFETEA-LU: the transportation problems to be addressed. Note: For the purposes of this and supporting documents, the terms MPO and TPO refer to the same organization.

#### **PURPOSE**

Each fiscal year, the Florida - Alabama Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), in cooperation with the Florida Department of Transportation and all transit operators, updates and advances the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) in response to transportation needs in the TPO Study Area. The purpose of the TIP is to provide a staged,

multi-year, intermodal program of transportation projects that is consistent with the TPO Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). TIP projects are typically improvements to the following transportation facilities or services: roads, airports, seaports, bicycle/pedestrian features, and public transportation, such as transit and transportation disadvantaged programs. The TIP contains all projects within the TPO area to be funded by Title 23 and Title 49 funds. The TIP also contains all regionally significant transportation projects for which federal action is required, regardless of whether the projects are to be funded with Title 23 and Title 49 funds.

#### SAFETEA-LU Regulations for TIP

Safe, Accountable, Flexible, and Efficient Transportation Equity Act: a Legacy for Users, (SAFETEA-LU) was signed into law by tation planning organizations are expected to incorporate SAFETEA-LU into their transportation plans effective July 1, 2007.

Therefore, it is critical to be aware of any updates and additions to previous legislation such as ISTEA and TEA-21. Section 6001 specifically addresses transportation improve-

- 1. TIP/STIP must be updated at least every four (4) years and contain four years worth of projects.
- 2. Plans must be consistent with planned growth and development plans (LRTP).
- 3. Security of the transportation system to be a "stand-alone" planning factor, and an increased priority from previous legislation.
- 4. MPO plans should include operational and management strategies to enhance the performance of the existing transportation facilities ability to relieve traffic congestion and maximize the safety of people and products.

publish or make available its transportation plans, including any documents in electronic format such as the world wide web.

- 6. Congestion Management Process in Transportation Management Areas (TMA): MPO must provide a process for "effective management" of transportation congestion.
- 7. Proposed TIP projects must be derived from locally developed public "human transit" transportation services including: Special Needs of Elderly Individuals and Individuals with Disabilities (See U.S.C. 49 sections 5310)
- 8. Visual aids should be included in TIP development such as photographs, charts, graphs, and any other visual aid that would enhance public knowledge of the project.

Note: The TIP must be in place prior to MPO and State adoption of transportation plans that address SAFETEA-LU provisions.

#### PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT PROCESS

SAFETEA-LU Section 6001:

The following lists important highlights of SAFETEA-LU Section 6001:

- 1. The "Participation Plan" must allow the public "reasonable opportunities" to provide input and feedback concerning the contents of transportation plans.
- 2. Conduct meetings at a time and a place "convenient and accessible" to the public.
- 3. Provide visual aids to assist the conveyance of planning information such as related maps, brochures, charts and graphs, slides, and other presentations, which allow a project to be visualized by the community.
- 4. Provide access to transportation documents on electronic mediums such as the Internet.
- 5. Any transportation plan utilizing federal assistance should be published in a manner that would be easily accessible by the public (i.e., Internet, local publication, or library resource)
- A Participation Plan must be adopted before a MPO receives any federal funding for TIP projects.

The draft TIP is presented to the MPO and its advisory committees for review in April

and May with the meeting agenda advertised in local newspapers and issued as a news release. The draft TIP will be posted on the TPO website. In June, the final version of the TIP will be endorsed by the TPO, again at an advertised meeting, based on advisory committee and public comments.

In cases where public comment is significant, 23 Code of Federal Regulation Part 450 requires the following:

"When significant written or oral comments are received on the draft transportation plan or TIP (including the financial plan) as a result of public involvement process required by the EPA's conformity regulations [for air quality], a summary analysis and report on the disposition of comments shall be made part of their final plan and TIP.

If the final transportation plan or TIP differs significantly from one which was made available for public comment by the TPO and raises new material issues which interested parties could not have reasonably foreseen from public involvement efforts, an additional opportunity for public comment on the revised TIP shall be made available.

If amendment to the TIP is required, public involvement shall be in accordance with CFR Part 450 Subpart C Section 326."

#### TRANSPORTATION PLANNING FACTORS

In 1997, the Transportation Equity Act of the 21st Century (TEA-21) broadened the planning factors and provided seven strategies for use in the project evaluation and selection process. The TPO considers these factors when working on the *Long Range Transportation Plan* (LRTP) and the *Unified Planning Work Program* (UPWP). According to TEA-21, any strategies used by the TPO in the development of transportation planning will:

1. Support the economic vitality of the metropolitan area and especially be enabling of global competitiveness, productivity and efficiency.

- 2. Increase the safety and security of the Transportation system for motorized and non- motorized users.
- 3. Increase the accessibility and mobility options available to people and freight.
- 4. Protect and enhance the environment, promote energy conservation, and improve the quality of life.
- 5. Enhance the integration and connectivity of the transportation system, across and between modes, for people and freight.
- 6. Promote efficient system management and operations.
- 7. Emphasize the preservation of the existing transportation system.

#### **AIR QUALITY**

In recent TIP years, the TPO staff for the Florida- Alabama and Bay County Transportation Planning Organizations has provided air quality information and ozone readings to the TPO membership on a semi- annual or annual basis, using Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) data. Since the Clean Air Act (et al), the 8- hour ozone standard implemented by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) (Titles 29 and 49, U.S. Code, July 1, 2004) was the basis for all reporting in Northwest Florida. On July 11, 2007 EPA published a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the Federal Register, with the clear intention of strengthening the standards. In anticipation of higher standards, and the likelihood that some, if not all, of the Planning Areas in Northwest Florida will no longer be in attainment of the Air Quality ground-level ozone (produced by truck and automobile exhaust) standards, and that increased planning dollars, documentation, staff time, and effort will be required to respond to a possible nonattainment status, pro-active adjustments are being made during the FY 2009-13 TIP cycle.

TPO tasking has been added to the 2-Year UPWP for FY 2009 and 2010, in effect ramping up report activity, establishing reporting guidelines, upgrading interaction with the

public and local governments, and repositioning as an information resource for Air Quality in Northwest Florida. Air Quality data will be collected and distributed on a quarterly basis, data will be reported to the TPO and Advisory Committees through normal monthly meetings, and staff will interact with government agencies and the public on *all* air quality issues (in addition to ground-level ozone). The new process will become evident with the changes and additions to the normal document production schedule, beginning with the FY 2009-13 TIP cycle (Project Priorities, Tentative Work Program, TIP).

#### MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS

To improve the efficiency of the existing transportation system, TEA-21 identifies one monitoring and six management systems: congestion management, intermodal management, pavement management, bridge management, and the traffic monitoring system.

#### **CONGESTION MANAGEMENT**

The TPO is responsible for implementing the Congestion Management Process (CMP) Plan, and projects identified in the Plan are included in the TIP. Each year the TPO updates its *Congestion Management Process Plan*. Projects identified through the CMP identification and evaluation process receive recognition in the TSM Project Priority criteria for development of the TIP. Projects identified through the CMP plan are given additional points in the TPO *Project Priorities*.

#### TRANSPORTATION DISADVANTAGED

Tables providing Transportation Disadvantaged (TD) revenues are shown under the tab "Transportation Disadvantaged Summary" of this document. State legislation contained in Chapter 427 F.S., requires that a summary of programs providing the funding for transportation of the disadvantaged must be included in the TIP.

#### TIP FINANCIAL CONSTRAINTS

The TIP is financially constrained each year by the Florida Department of Transportation Work Program and also the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). This is the result of close coordination of TIP development between the TPO and the Department and results when the TPO provides project Priorities to the Department, which funds the priorities until the annual funding is consumed.

The TIP Projects listings below show the funding available for each project from each source by year.

Two pie charts are located in the appendix under funding Source Listings, Financial Summaries and Charts, showing the TPO project funding. The first is in percentages by type of project and representative dollar amounts in millions of dollars. The second is a break down of primary funding sources and dollar amounts.

#### **TIP PROCESS**

In April the TPO (MPO) produces a Draft Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), based on the Five Year Work Program and the adopted Project Priorities. All of the detailed funding and phase information comes from the descriptions in the Work Program. In April the Draft TIP is presented to the TPO and it's advisory committees for review, with the meeting agenda advertised in the local newspapers and issued as a press release to the local media. FDOT on criteria established through bridge It is also posted on the TPO website.

In May, after receiving comments, the Draft is revised and changes are made in an electronic format available on the TPO website. Hardcopy changes are available by request.

In June, the revised TIP is endorsed by the TPO, again at an advertised meeting, based on advisory committee reviews and public comment.

#### PROJECT SELECTION

Code of Federal Regulations \*CFR) 3325 (b) which states "... projects to be implemented using title 23 funds other than Federal Lands Funds or Federal Transit Act Funds shall be selected by the state and / or the MPO for the approved metropolitan TIP." Projects were selected from the planning area shown on the map provided, but other projects of regional significance outside the planning area were included

#### PROJECT CATAGORIES

**Aviation** – Aviation projects are drawn from the airport master Plan and Airport Layout Plan, developed by local authorities and reviewed by the DOT and the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). Project Priorities are given to the TPO for inclusion in the report and may be funded by the FAA, FDOT, or Airport Authority. Airfields included in this report are the Pensacola Regional Airport and the Peter Prince Field in Milton.

Bicycle/Pedestrian - The TPO #5 Capacity funded Project Priority has been \$125,000 per year to fund bicycle/ pedestrian improvements. New funding in 2013 will be \$300,000 annually. The projects are identified in the TPO Bicycle Pedestrian Plan and are added to the Long Range Transportation Plan.

**Bridge** – These projects are selected by the inspections. Bridge Sufficiency Ratings are established by the FHWA and are on a 0 (worst) to 100 (best). Funds are generally available for rehabilitation work if the bridge rating falls below 80, or are available for replacement if the rating falls below 50.

Capacity – Projects (such as widening existing roads or building roads on new alignments) in the TIP are from the Cost Feasible Plan of the TPO Long Range Transportation Plan Update and the Project Priorities. **Enhancement**– TEA –21 legislation contains provisions for transportation enhancement projects, requiring the 10% of federal funds allocated to the state are for projects, including:

- 1. Provisions for bicycle / pedestrian facilities.
- 2. Bicycle / pedestrian safety and education activities.
- 3. Acquisition of scenic and or historical sights.
- 4. Scenic or historic highway programs.
- 5. Landscape, viewscape, or other scenic beautification.
- 6. Historic preservation.
- 7. Rehabilitation and operation of historical transportation buildings, structures, or facilities.
- 8. Preservation of abandoned railway corridors or conversion for pedestrian or bicycle trails.
- 9. Control and removal of outdoor advertising.
- 10. Archaeological planning and research.
- 11. Mitigation of water pollution due to stormwater runoff.
- 12. Establishment of transportation museums. Local government may submit applications for funding of enhancement projects. District 3 allocates approximately \$2.5 million per fiscal year towards this process.

Miscellaneous - Supplemental projects not fitting into any one category.

**Public Transportation** – Transit projects are drawn from the TPO Five Year Transit Development Plan and priorities are provided to the TPO by the local transit operator. Projects for Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC) and the Escambia County Area Transit (ECAT) fixed route service are included in the TIP. The FTA is the primary funding source for ECAT projects, with supplementation by matching grants by the city of Pensacola and

directly from the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged.

Resurfacing - Also known as system preservation, these projects are determined by the FDOT. While the TPO may ask that particular roadways be examined for resurfacing needs, the priority for resurfacing is based on an engineering evaluation of pavement condition. Resurfacing projects on the State Highway System are funded through a statewide program.

Seaport - Port projects are drawn from the adopted Port Master Plan, for area deepwater seaports. They are primarily the domain of city government, and though the TIP is consistent with city plans, their inclusion is primarily due to the recent formation of the Seaport and Economic Development Trust Fund. This fund provides state money through the Florida Ports Council for port projects. The Port of Pensacola is the only deepwater port in this report.

Transportation Systems Management (TSM) - Drawn from the FDOT Candidate list and the TPO Priorities for TSM Improvements, these projects may also be identified in the TPO CMO. Some are part of studies by FDOT or local governments and are needed to improve mobility and /or safety at intersections and along existing roadways. TSM projects are typically low cost and can be constructed in

#### LEVEL OF EFFORT

less than two years with allocated District 3

At the request of the Alabama Department of Transportation, the following statement is included in the FL-AL TPO TIP: Projects in the STIP/TIP, which are referred to as LEVEL of EFFORT (LVOE), represent certain unidentified projects which will be authorized during the given fiscal. These projects are placed in the STIP/TIP according to selected funding programs with their anticipated

funds.

apportionments for each fiscal year within the plan. The selected funding programs include:

- 1. Transportation Enhancement Projects
- 2. Safety Projects such as hazard elimination roadway and rail, high speed rail, seat belt, blood alcohol content, etc.
- 3. Transportation and Community and System Preservation
- 4. Recreational Trails
- 5. Federal Aid Resurfacing Program
- 6. GARVEE Bond Projects
- 7. County Allocated Funds such as Off System Bridge, Optional Bridge, and STP nonurban.
- 8. Federal Transit Sections 5311 (non-urban), and 5310 (Elderly and Disabilities)

Any of these LVOE type projects are pre-approved by the MPO and will not require any further MPO action prior to authorization. The MPO's will be notified as soon as the specific projects within their urban areas are selected and will have five days to decline the project. [See Appendix I, Authorized Projects.]

#### **AMENDMENT PROCESS**

Amendments to the TIP are made in accordance with Chapter 5 of the MPO Program Management manual. The TPO has authorized the WFRPC Executive Director to administra- portation Planning Organization is created by tively approve the following amendments:

- 1. Airport and seaport amendments, which do not materially affect surface transportation volumes in the vicinity of the subject airport or seaport.
- 2. Amendments which do not require a formal TIP amendment as described in Chapter 5, Section 5.13 of the MPO Program Management handbook.

#### CONSISTENCY WITH OTHER PLANS

Consistency with local government comprehensive plans is achieved through the long range planning process and the participation of local government staff on the TPO Technical Coordinating Committee (TCC) and the Bicycle Pedestrian Advisory Committee

(BPAC). TCC and BPAC members participate in the development of the Project Priorities and make recommendations to the TPO. Projects submitted by the TPO further the goals and objectives of the TPO LRTP and the Florida Transportation Plan (FTP).

#### **CERTIFICATIONS**

The last Joint FDOT/TPO Certification was held in February of 2008. The last FHWA/FTA Certification was held in June of 2006. The Joint FDOT/TPO Certification is an annual process with District 3.

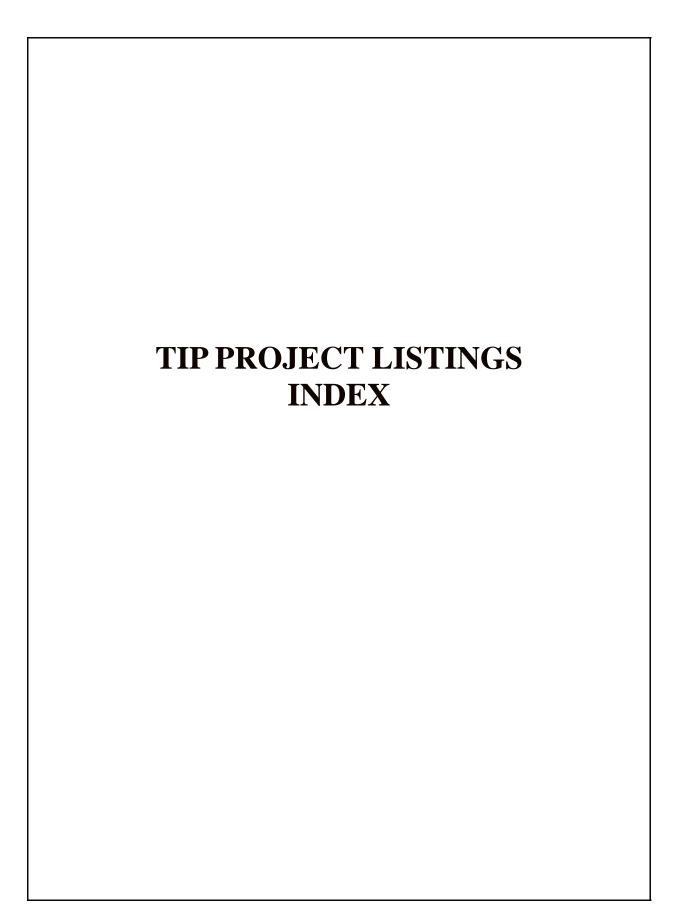
#### **CONCLUSION**

The TIP represents a shift away from traditional highway growth and movement toward a multi-modal usage and planning. Accordingly, this methodology requires more intergovernmental coordination than in the past. The report is updated annually to reflect changes in the needs of the region. The TIP attempts to address those concerns deemed important by the citizens who are most affected.

#### NORTHWEST FLORIDA **REGIONAL TPO**

The Northwest Florida Regional Transan interlocal agreement between Florida-Alabama and the Okaloosa-Walton TPO to study regional transportation issues affecting a four county region (Escambia, Santa Rosa, Okaloosa, and Walton Counties). The coordinated planning process includes the adoption of a Regional Network Map and Regional Network Priorities. The adopted FY 2009-2013 Priorities are included in the appendix of this document.

The Regional Network Project Priorities are broken out into funding categories to facilitate the understanding of how they are anticipated to be paid for in the adopted Florida-Alabama and Okaloosa-Walton TPO Cost Feasible Plans. The tables in Appendix F contain the RTPO priorities by primary funding sources.



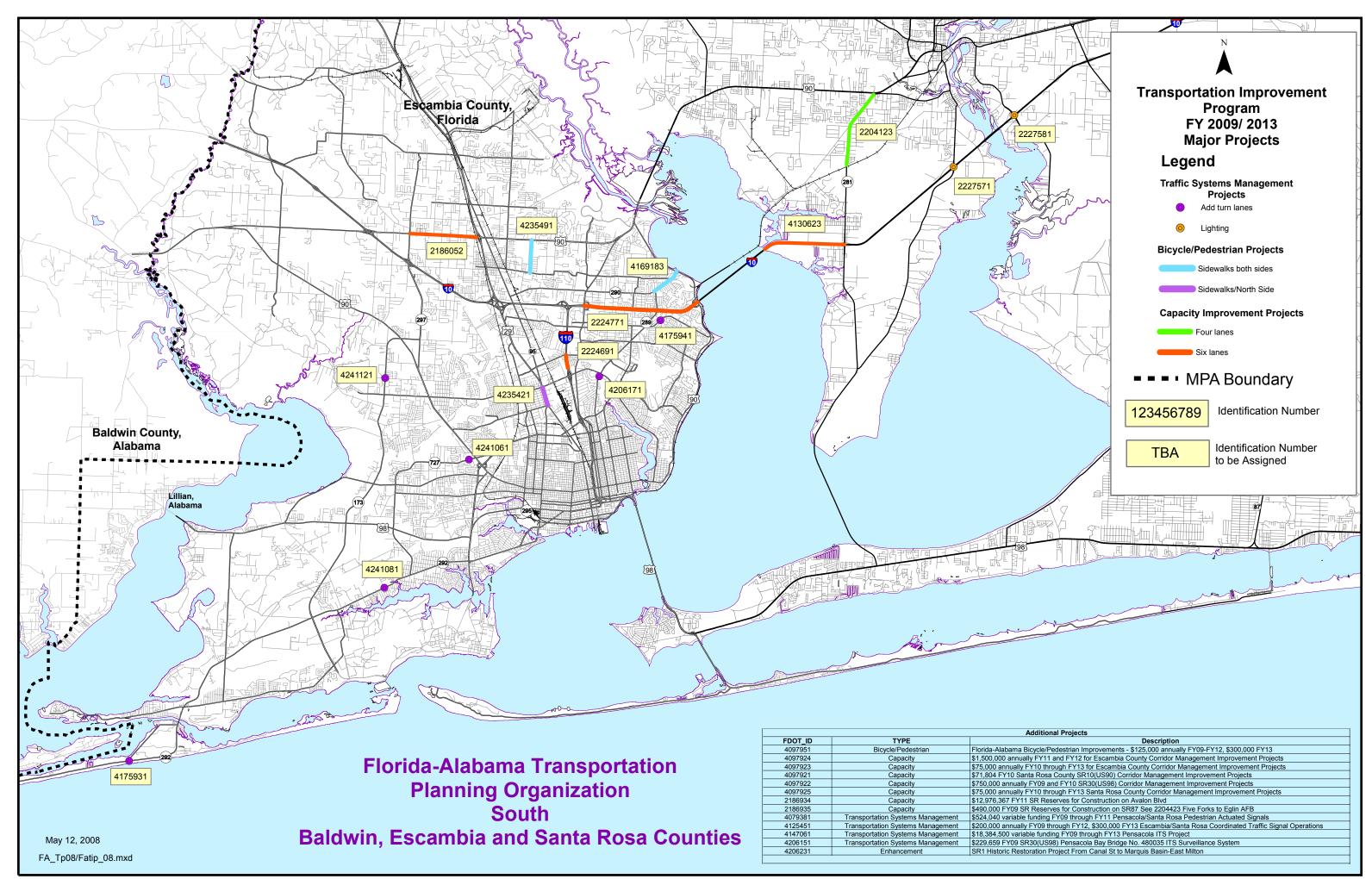

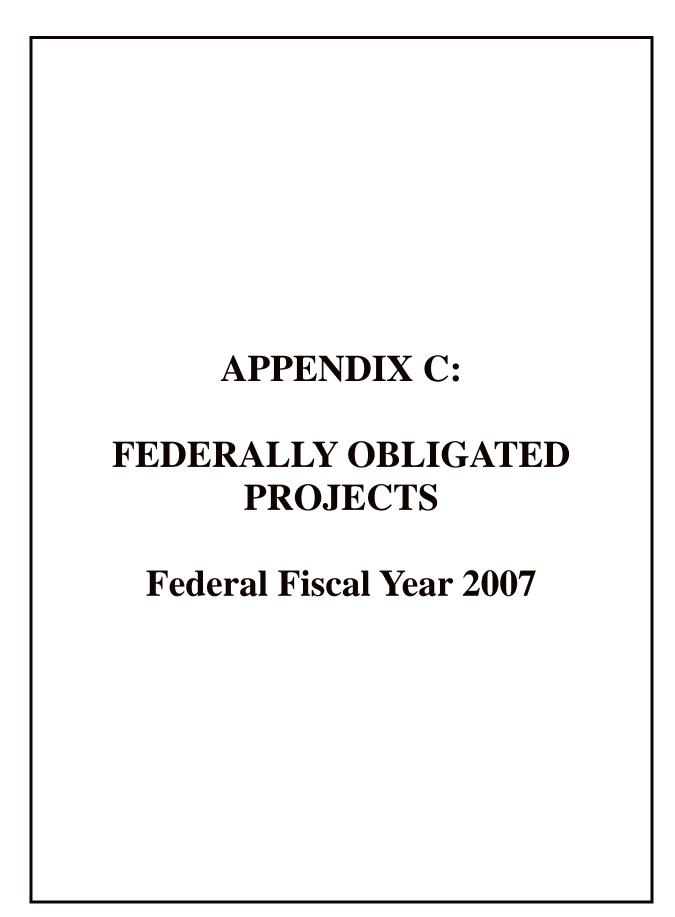


# How a Project Moves from Planning to Construction:
